

What is a Lasallian Collegian?

There are only two requirements for participation in the Collegians Program:

- 1) You must be a graduate of a Lasallian high school or you must currently attend a Lasallian college.
- 2) You must have completed at least one year of college studies.



A simple desire to stay connected to the Lasallian family is all you need.

Collegians are graduates of Lasallian high schools or current college students at a Lasallian institution who seek to remain connected to the Lasallian mission and to build community with those who share their passion to learn, lead, and serve.

Collegian Events

Collegians are invited to participate in a number of events throughout the year. Some of these events include:

*Annual Lasallian Collegian Retreat

This thematic retreat is held annually (usually during the winter session break) and allows the Collegians a chance to catch up, refocus, and reflect on their individual journeys in a supportive environment among peers.

Collegians also take active leadership roles and participate in some of the high school events. Some of these events include:

*Lasallian Youth Assembly

This assembly is held annually during the summer and attended by many of our Lasallian high schools. Lasallian Youth members who participate in this week-long assembly come together as a Lasallian family to engage in prayer and reflection and serve the greater community while they are educated around the theme of social justice.

*Lasallian Student Leaders Program

The Lasallian Student Leaders Program brings together various leaders from the Lasallian high schools for a week at Saint Mary's College of California. LSL participants are trained in essential leadership skills and introduced to the CORE principles of a Lasallian school. Student leaders are challenged to share ideas and strategies, work together, and use the skills of a successful Lasallian leader. The program incorporates seminars, committee meetings, and community events to help students learn how to positively and effectively work with each other in order to achieve a common goal.
